Information for parents or guardians of pupils at secondary schools (level 5 and higher)

The more regularly your child participates in the free "Alles gurgelt!" testing programme, the safer their everyday school life and leisure activities will be. Testing **protects** your child and the people around you. To participate in the "Alles gurgelt!" in-school testing programme you need to hand in a signed **consent form** at your child's school.

There are two ways of getting a **test kit** for your child:

- 1) Register at lead-horizon.org/public and get your personal barcode to pick up your test kits at any BIPA outlet in Vienna.
- 2) Test kits are also available **at your child's school**.

If your child has already registered with "Alles gurgelt!" and has already done tests at home, add the **information** about your child's school and class to their profile in the WebApp when entering your child's personal details. To do so your child needs to start a new test in the WebApp and can add the school and class in their personal profile.

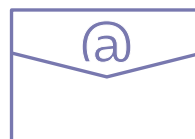
To help make school safe, your child can either **gargle** at home using the WebApp or **rinse** their mouth with saline solution at school supervised by their teacher.

The collection boxes at schools will be emptied **from Monday to Thursday at 8:30am** and **optionally on Friday between 1:30pm and 4pm**. The samples will then be analysed at the Lifebrain COVID laboratory. Usually, the test results are available not later than at the beginning of the next school day. You can also hand in your sample at any REWE outlet (BIPA, BILLA, BILLA PLUS, Penny, petrol stations with REWE shop) in Vienna from Monday to Sunday. Please note that these samples will be collected daily at 9am and 2pm.

If you provide an **email address** for your child in your child's WebApp profile or in the school's consent form, you will receive your test result via email directly from the Lifebrain COVID laboratory. To retrieve your child's laboratory report you also need to provide a valid mobile phone number.

If you do not provide an email address, your school will contact you or your child **by phone** if your child's test result is positive, as teachers are able to view the test results via the school's WebApp.

Schools are always informed about all of their pupils' **test results**. This helps them to monitor the tests and makes everyday school life safer.
